Enlargement and foreign policy – reactive or proactive?

Enlargement Transforming Foreign Policy

- Foreign Policy within a limited scope
- Colonies, former colonies, and development policy
- European Free Trade Association (EFTA)
- Eastern European countries as pro-Atlanticists

Integration Trajectory of Foreign Policy

- Integration as default mode
- European Economic Area (EEA)
 - "Enlargement without membership"
- Eastern Partnership Association Agreements
 - Deep and comprehensive FTAs (DCFTA)
- Convergence without membership guarantees?

Enlargement as Foreign Policy

- Most successful act of foreign policy that the EU has ever made." Wim Kok
- Extending influence in the region and the tensions that can raise



Foreign policy and territorial disputes

Sphere of Influence?: Candidate Countries

- Do Candidate countries (have to) align with EU Foreign Policy?
 - Copenhagen Criteria
 - Stability and Association Agreements
 - Pre-Accession Assistant (IPA) Funds
 - Not officially tied to compliance with CFSP, but does provide possible legal basis for limiting funding for those candidate countries not in alignment
- Case Study: Western Balkans & Russian Invasion of Ukraine
 - Flaunting: Serbia
 - Struggling: Bosnia and Herzegovina (but not required to align as only potential candidate)
 - Aligning: Albania, North Macedonia, Montenegro (generally)


CFSP Alignment of EU Enlargement Countries






European Coal and Steel Community, 1951



New Policies for New Neighbors

TEU Article 8

- Special relationship with neighbors
- "The Union shall develop a special relationship with neighbouring countries, aiming to establish an area of prosperity and good neighbourliness."

European Neighborhood Policy (2003)

- Privileged partnership toward southern and eastern neighbors
- Reform agenda
- Convergence of ENP with broader CFSP goals

Schengen and JHA

- Hardening borders
- Visa regimes

Foreign Policy in Territorial Disputes

- Good neighborliness as a criteria for accession
 - Copenhagen Criteria
 - Agenda 2000
 - Uneven application

Concerns with good neighbourliness conditionality

- Used by MS to resolve bilateral disputes
